We are so proud of our Academaniacs!















HOVEMBER FIELD TRIP

Heard Museum — Phoenix, AZ

Our field trip to the Heard Museum was a powerful day of reflection, inspiration, and cultural learning. From the moment we arrived, students were immersed in stories, art, and histories that encouraged them to pause, think deeply, and honor the living cultures of Native communities.

As we explored the exhibits, students saw how artifacts, artwork, and first—person voices connect the past, present, and future of Arizona. They reflected on empathy, cultural understanding, and how shared innovation helps us coexist respectfully and uplift every community's contributions.

The HOME exhibition took students on a vivid journey through the American Indian Southwest with nearly 2,000 cultural treasures, immersive environments, and interactive learning spaces. The Sky-Dome experience in Substance of Stars invited them into a breathtaking world of Indigenous sky knowledge, landscapes, languages, and spiritual traditions that have guided communities for generations.

Students were especially moved by October Art: The Collection of Delores Browne Abelson and the retrospective of Bob Haozous, whose work challenged them to view art as social commentary, cultural expression, and a form of truth—telling. These exhibits highlighted how one person's passion or one artist's voice can influence generations.

By the end of the visit, students shared that they felt more connected to the land, more aware of the histories they inherit, and more committed to honoring the cultures around them. This experience was not just a field trip, but a meaningful journey through story, identity, resilience, and art one that will stay with them for years to come.
